Introducing G.J. "Sarge" Pilioglos Staff Sergeant

Sarge was born on August 1948 in Summerville, MA, however, he was raised in North Carolina on a farm. The farm was large and consisted of cotton, corn and tobacco. When Sarge was young, around the age 5, he started working side-by-side planting and picking the cotton and harvesting the corn. Around the age of 10 or 12 he started working the tobacco fields driving the tractor. This was a job he really liked and he was great at it. As he grew older, he really knew his way around the fields and most of the operations. So, when it came time to hang the tobacco, he didn't like doing that he wanted to go back and drive the tractor.

Most of us know that Sarge enjoys riding motorcycles and has pretty much all of his life. At the age of 5, he had a homemade motorcycle from a Schwinn bicycle and a lawn mower engine. He rode this back and forth to school until the 3rd grade. Then he got a Honda trail 90. It wasn't until he entered the Marines that he bought his first Harley a 1966 Generator Shovel. Today he rides a 1999 Road King Police Interceptor.

Sarge entered the Marines at the age of 17 when a Judge in Cumberland County told him six months on a chain gang or join the military. Sarge chose the military and says it was the **best** thing that ever happened to him. It made him straighten up and become a responsible man. Sarge was in the Marines from 1965 to 1974 and saw action in the Vietnam War. Then in 1983 he joined the Army and served until December 30, 1990. We didn't talk of how he became disabled from the military just that he suffers from multiple gunshot wounds and PTSD.

What he liked the most about being in the military was/is the camaraderie; and it was the politics he disliked the most.

Sarge joined Post 2093 in 2007. He said he liked this Post the most because the members would stand up when the National Anthem was played. He didn't see the pride and respect for our Country at the other Post he visited. If you are ever in the Post when Sarge is there and our National Anthem is playing, you can hear Sarge say, "all rise and uncover." Sarge has been a Trustee for 10 years, has been the Sergeant At-Arms and is our 2021-2022 Sr. Vice.

Sarge enjoys tinkering on engines and his ole buddy the 1979 Shovelhead that is now in parts. He had hoped to get it back together, but he feels that he can no longer ride her. He really prides himself on helping others whether it be working on any type of motor or helping to put in and design a sprinkler system. He likes the comradery in helping others and is always willing to join in.

Sarge has one brother who has passed, two sisters and one of them has passed on, however, the youngest sister is living in MO. Sarge also has one son and one daughter.

Sarge's favorite saying is, "To Never Hesitate To Say What's On Your Mind. Because There Will Never Be A Doubt Of What Is On Mine." Above all be honest and stand for our County and Post.

Remember our Post survives on Volunteers. In 2021, please consider doing your part. Do what you can. When you can. We have many **opportunities** where <u>YOU</u> can make a difference. Just let the Bartender or Post Officer know you want to volunteer and they will match you with what we need now or in the near future.

- ★ Apr 06, 2021 · All Veterans and their Spouses and Caregivers are eligible to get vaccinated for the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) through the Department of Veterans Affairs, ... Contact your local VA Scheduling Office—Lake Nona 407-631-1000.
- * Do you qualify for CHAMPVA? <u>CHAMPVA Eligibility Community Care</u>
- Additional Property Tax Exemptions Any real estate owned and used as a homestead by a veteran, who was honorably discharged and has been certified as having a service connected, permanent and total disability, is exempt from taxation if the veteran is a permanent resident of Florida and has legal title to the property on Jan. 1 of the tax year for which exemption is being claimed. (FS 196.081(1)) Contact Orange County Property Appraiser (407) 836-5044
- ★ Vehicle License Plate Free if 100% Total & Permanently disabled. Take your rating letter to the DMV.
- * Permanently and totally disabled veterans can get a Florida driver's license for free.
- Visit the <u>Florida Department of Veterans Affairs</u> website for more information on any of these programs.
 - ★ State Park Admission Veterans with service-connected disabilities and their spouses or surviving spouses get a free lifetime pass.
 - ★ Hunting and Fishing Licenses: 100% permanently and totally disabled service-connected veterans are entitled to a free five year hunting and fishing license.
