Chaplin's Corner



Happy New Year 2093!

This month we remember the heroes of World War II and specifically those who fought in the Battle of the Bulge. In December 1944, General Patton's Third Army was ready to provide relief to the men at the front, but bad weather threatened their advance. General Patton contacted his Chaplain, Father James H. O'Neil to provide a prayer, in attempt to implore the Lord to intervene. Chaplain O'Neil composed the following:

Almighty and most merciful Father, we humbly beseech Thee, of Thy great goodness, to restrain these immoderate rains with which we have had to contend. Grant us fair weather for Battle. Graciously hearken to us as soldiers who call upon Thee that, armed with Thy power, we may advance from victory to victory, and crush the oppression and wickedness of our enemies and establish Thy justice among men and nations.

General Patton had the prayer distributed among the men saying, "We must ask God to stop these rains. These rains are that margin that holds defeat or victory. If we all pray...it will be like plugging in on a current whose source in in Heaven. I believe that prayer completes that circuit. It is power."

This prayer card was distributed to all the men, with a Christmas Greeting printed on the reverse side between December 12th and 14th. Two days later the American armies were able to engage the enemy in the Battle of the Bulge.

I pray that we all find inner meaning in this story. When we feel that the obstacles that stand in our way are too big for us to control, let us remember to find peace and pray.



Member Spotlight

Introducing Army Specialist, Justin Kent, Purple Heart Recipient, age 37

Justin is an Orlando native who grew up on the west side of Orlando, FL. Justin went to West Orange High School. He did not care for the typical curriculum so he dropped out and went to work with his Uncle Mark full time. He enjoyed working with his hands and seeing a finished product. Justin grew up not knowing his biological father. While he had two uncles, grandmother and mother who cared for his well-being at a young age, Uncle Mark became the one he looked up to the most. Justin says he learned about integrity and to stand up for what you believe in from his uncle.

During his free time, he enjoyed watching documentaries about WWI & WWII and history. He became deeply moved to fight evil, he wanted to protect a pantheon (a group of persons most highly regarded for contributions to a field or endeavor); therefore, a need to serve. He joined the Army Infantry in 2005. Asked why the Army he says he was inspired by a quote from President Theodore Roosevelt, "Far better is it to dare mighty things, to win glorious triumphs, even though checkered by failure... than to rank with those poor spirits who neither enjoy nor suffer much, because they live in a gray twilight that knows not victory nor defeat." Justin went to Bagdad where he helped to setup a sting operation inside Bagdad where they were looking for the bad people. I believe Justin referred to it as, "looking for evil almost like the Whack-A-Mole game."

On March 15, 2007, his van was hit by an IED. The truck commander instructed the driver to keep going. They made it two more blocks before they were hit by a second attack. Justin was knocked unconscious by a blow to his head. After he came to, he saw his fellow soldiers also unconscious. He gathered everyone to safety. Later he asked the medic when he was going to return to fighting, he was told that he was going home. Justin loss six (6) of his comrades during his first deployment and suffers from Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

Today, he is learning Python a computer coding language. He has created a hobby in building and repairing computers to maximize their performance. He enjoys seeking a solution for people's computer issues. He will help be happy to assist anyone with his or her computer problems. During his free time, Justin volunteers for Meals on Wheels and for our Post. I asked what he liked most about our Post, he said, he loved how we all came together during COVID to keep our Post alive, but mostly how we are here for each other, after all we are our brothers and sisters.

At the end of this interview, he described himself as the "real deal" what you see is what you get. He also committed to seeing his mother more often. He described her as a selflessness person, a person who gives him a sense of re-calibration by her presence, as she is someone who is pure of heart.


