Introducing Lee Wozniak, 1st Army Sergeant

Lee was born in Grand Rapids, MI in May 1931. He signed up to go into the Army right after high school to avoid being drafted. Lee entered the Korean War in March 1951. His basic training was at Scofield Barracks in Hawaii. He had to travel by ship which took 30 days to cross the Pacific. From Hawaii he went to Japan. He said when he got to Japan the first thing, they made him do was climb a poll. Lee did not like heights. He must have done well because they put him in the 10th Army Signal Corps. He laid communication wire across mountains.

Lee served 27 years. He had seven years in Korean War and served three tours in the Vietnam War. During the Vietnam War he worked on helicopter as a maintenance supervisor and instructor. When he retired, he obtained a job with Bell Helicopter training the Saudis and Iranians. Lee traveled to many places with Bell, he said he traveled the world several times.

Lee is a twin! Sad that his twin sister died at a young age of 18 months. He has a younger sister who he calls every day to check on her. His parents came from Poland and purchased a 130-acre dairy farm. When Lee was about 10 years old, his father would "farm out" Lee to work. He worked six to seven days a week in a bakery. When the business closed on Wednesdays, Lee enjoyed going fishing. When he went into the Army, he had saved over \$6,000.

Lee enjoyed working and did not have much time to date. Then at the age of 58 he met his wife through a mutual friend and married at the age .of 59 in Thailand. Then had his daughter at the age of 60. Someone once said that he had a beautiful granddaughter, Lee replied, "hell, that's my daughter!" It was proud moment for Lee. He loved teaching his daughter and the thing that stood out the most was that he taught her not to take any crap from anyone.

Lee lived in College Park and joined Post 2093 in the 1980's. In 2000, Lee served as Quarter Master and was in our Color Guard. If asked, Lee said if he had his life to live over again, he would not change a thing.

Lee received two Bronze Stars and Meritorious Service Medal.

If you see Lee in the Post, please introduce yourself grab a drink and sit down to talk with him, He has so many interesting stories to tell.

- ★ Vehicle License Plate Free if 100% Total & Permanently disabled. Take your rating letter to the DMV

 - * State Park Admission Veterans with service-connected disabilities and their spouses or surviving spouses get a free lifetime pass.
 - * Hunting and Fishing Licenses: 100% permanently and totally disabled service-connected veterans are entitled to a free five year hunting and fishing license.
