National PTSD Awareness Day: Honoring Healing and Understanding



Every year on June 27, the United States observes National PTSD Awareness Day to shed light on post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), a mental health condition affecting millions of Americans. This day serves as a reminder of the importance of recognizing the symptoms of PTSD and supporting those who live with its challenges.

Origins and Significance

National PTSD Awareness Day was officially designated by the U.S. Senate in 2010 through Senate Resolution 541. The date, June 27, was chosen to honor the birthday of Staff Sergeant Joe Biel, a North Dakota National Guard member who tragically died by suicide in 2007 after battling PTSD following two tours in Iraq. In 2014, the Senate expanded this recognition by designating the entire month of June as PTSD Awareness Month .

Understanding PTSD

PTSD can develop after experiencing or witnessing a traumatic event, such as combat, sexual assault, natural disasters, or serious accidents. Symptoms may include flashbacks, nightmares, emotional numbness, and heightened anxiety. While commonly associated with military veterans, PTSD affects individuals from all walks of life, including survivors of abuse, first responders, and civilians who have endured traumatic experiences.

According to the National Center for PTSD, approximately 12 million adults in the U.S. suffer from PTSD in a given year, yet many do not seek treatment due to stigma or lack of awareness.

How to Observe

Observing National PTSD Awareness Day can involve several meaningful actions:

Educate Yourself and Others: Learn about PTSD's symptoms and treatments to better understand and support those affected.

Support Organizations: Consider donating to or volunteering with organizations that assist individuals with PTSD, such as the Wounded Warrior Project or the National Center for PTSD.

Promote Awareness: Use social media platforms to share information and resources, helping to reduce stigma and encourage those in need to seek help.

Encourage Professional Help: If you or someone you know is experiencing symptoms of PTSD, reach out to mental health professionals for support and treatment options.

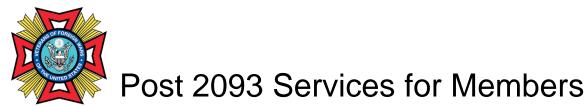

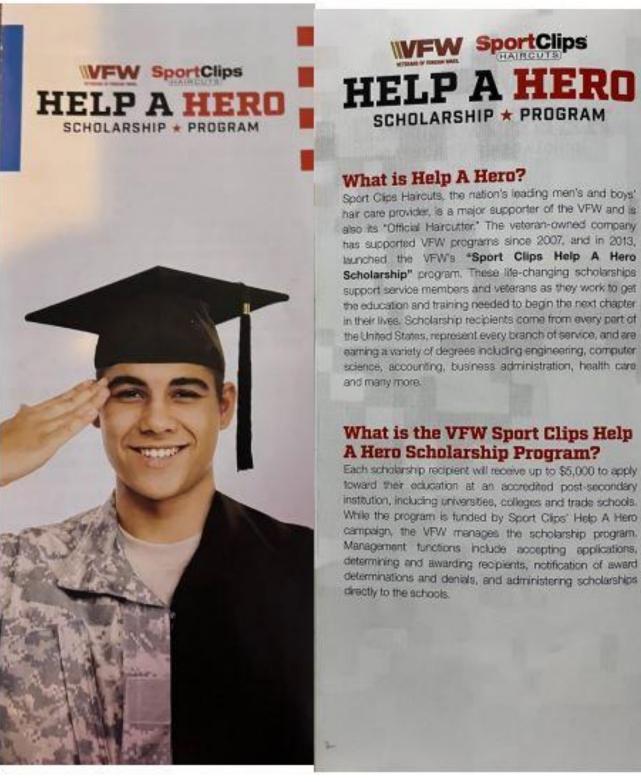
