

Introducing Marine Staff Sergeant, Lewis Maddox

Lewis was born in Columbia, Alabama on April 13, 1931. It was a little country town were neighbors were rare. Lewis said growing up in the country you did not have many friends except for the ones you made at school. He had several siblings, one sister and three brothers, however, they all were very much younger then him. One of his favorite things to do was on most days after school he would walk down to the creek to go fishing. Lewis never missed a day of school. He really enjoyed being around other children it gave him someone his age to talk and play with. When he started high school he joined the football team as a defensive tackle, Lewis loved to play football and enjoys watching it today.

Growing up Lewis had an uncle who was a Marine during WWII; and he and Lewis had conversations about the war, and the service and duty to Country. Lewis proudly joined the Marines to follow in his uncles footsteps. About the time when the Korean War was getting started, he entered the Marines on July 10, 1950. After the Korean War, the Marines were downsizing. Lewis got out of the service July 10, 1963 and moved to Orlando to be with his father.

He discovered a restaurant where a pretty woman who worked at the Howard Johnsons on Highway 441. He frequent this restaurant often and finally met Bertha. A few years later in 1968, they went on a two-week vacation to Ft. Myers. It was at that moment they decided to get married right then. They found a minister at the Methodist Church who performed the ceremony and two strangers stood with them. Lewis said they had a great time in Ft. Myers. They were never able to have any children; however, Lewis said he never had any regrets, until Bertha passed away.

Lewis worked for the Orange County Schools in the maintenance department for 22 years. Several people he worked with were members of the VFW and they encouraged Lewis to join. Lewis joined in 1968, when Gene Thomas was commander. Gene, if you are reading this, Lewis would like to share a beer and conversation with you.

I asked what he liked most about this Post; he said he loves the people, the camaraderie between the guys and, especially our commander, Charlie Morton. He enjoys talking with the guys about their time in the service and comparing it to his time in the service.

You can find Lewis here most every day after 3:00 pm holding up his favorite barstool.



#### <Cover Story>

Tom Zwetow was in a little depression in between some rocks. Part of the tower fell on top of him, and buried him alive under the rubble. The NVA swarmed over the tower and fired down at the company below (Delta) who had rested that night below us. Later that day February 17, a fresh squad was given orders to re-take the tower. It reported that Tom was MIA. They went back up the tower with re-supplied ammo and lot's of grenades. The NVA was routed off the tower again. Someone heard a moaning sound from under the rocks where it had be known of Tom's last position. With a couple of Marines we started digging away the rocks, after several large stones were removed, Tom's helmet was spotted, they dug deeper and uncovered Tom's head and part of one arm. We removed his helmet after asking for "Corpsmen up" and washed the dust and dirt from his eyes with an M-16 bandolier, dipped in canteen water. We were trying to reassure him and some shed tears of joy that he was alive. Although he was terribly wounded and in shock he smiled. The NVA were literally standing on top of him and he could hear them shouting as they fired at Delta Co. Tom Zweto was born on May 27 1948 and died on January 19 1998 as a result of damage incurred to his heart that February day.


